The EFG is linked to Europeana, the digital showcase of Europe's cultural and scientific heritage. BEHIND THE PORTAL: THE EFG PROJECT

Initiated by the Association des Cinémathèques Européennes (ACE), the EFG project runs from September 2008 until August 2011 and is carried out jointly by 22 partners and contributors from 16 European countries. In order to achieve its main goal – developing a central access point to materials held in film archives – the project tackles a number of relevant issues, like technical and semantic interoperability as well as best practices for rights clearing. The project is coordinated by the Deutsches Filminstitut in Frankfurt.
