



# Join the Europeana Teacher Community

Bring digital cultural heritage into the classroom, enrich students' educational experiences

The Europeana Education initiative aims to mainstream the use of digital culture in the classrooms, across curricula and at a transnational level. Europeana Foundation (EF) and European Schoolnet (EUN) have been working together for the last five years in making that happen, working closely with teachers from across Europe.

### The Europeana Teacher Community 2018-2019

In the 2018-2019 academic year, over 2,118 teachers from 45 countries, teaching in primary and secondary schools, have been involved in creating learning scenarios and using them in classes, sharing their experiences on the Teaching with Europeana blog, and following the Europeana Massive Open Online Courses (MOOC).



#### **Europeana Teacher** community

In this school year, we engaged with 2,118 teachers from across Europe. 13 of them (from ES, FI, FR, GR, HR, HU, IT, MT, PL, PT, RO, TR, and the European Schools) represent the Europeana Teacher Ambassador network. They coordinate the Europeana Education User Group, consisting of 130 teachers. Together, they contribute to the animation of the *Teaching* with Europeana blog by creating and testing learning scenarios using Europeana resources.



#### **Europeana Massive Open Online Courses**

During the first year of the project, the English version of the Europeana MOOC has attracted more than 3,500 registrants. An updated version ran for the second time from January 2019. The course was translated to Spanish and Portuguese and ran in March 2019. Participants from 45 countries joined these MOOCs. At the end of the courses, 700 teachers graduated successfully and received their certification.



#### **Teaching with Europeana blog**

Launched in March 2019, the Teaching with Europeana blog not only provides resources but also functions as a platform where teachers can give and get feedback about their learning materials and share different approaches and ideas on how to get students' attention. The blog already counts more than 200 learning scenarios and stories of implementation.



#### The Europeana Webinars

From January until June 2019, the Europeana Teacher Ambassadors carried out a total of 24 webinars on the national

Each webinar gave teachers an overview of the use of digital cultural heritage in education and presented the Europeana platform and its vast amount of resources. The webinars also guided viewers through the Teaching with Europeana blog. The recordings are now available on YouTube.
