#### **Aggregator Forum meeting April 2017**

The first Aggregator Forum meeting of 2017 was co-organised by EF in The Hague from 18-19 April 2017. Fourty-three colleagues representing 26 aggregators and EF attended these one-and-a-half-days long workshops in the Europeana offices. We worked extensively on the future aggregation landscape, discussed the work we do for data distribution (thematic collections, Europeana Research, Europeana4Education) and worked on next steps to improve data quality. 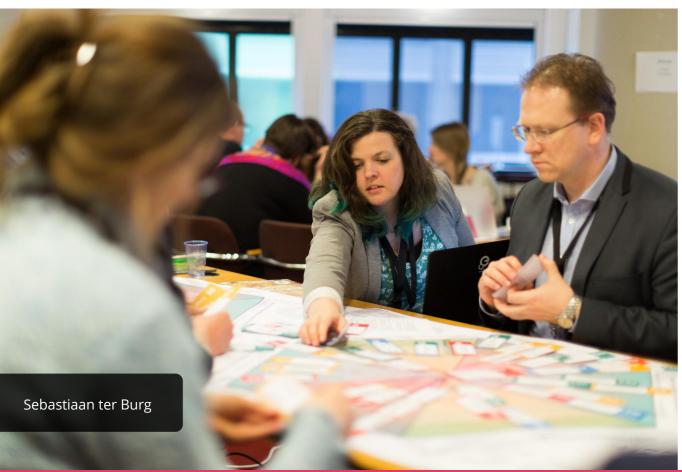

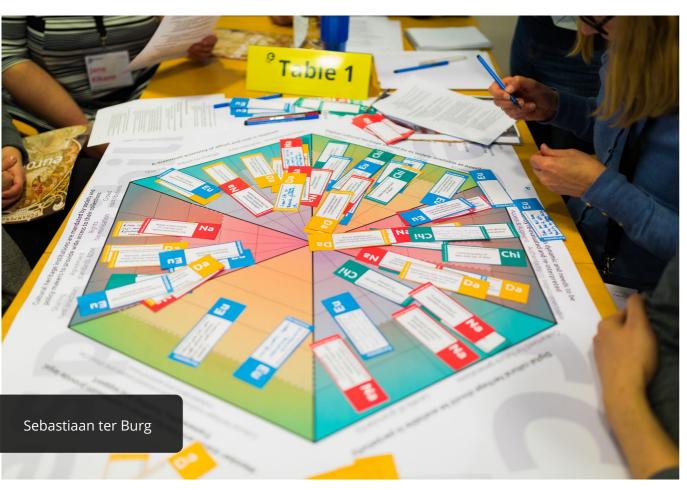
